Oral Interview Sample Questions

- 1. Interviewee's name (full name if possible), age, gender
- 2. Relationship to the interviewer (student)
- 3. When and where were you born?
- 4. Where were your parents born? When did your parents come to this country (*if immigrants*) or area (*if migrants*), and what did they do?
- 5. Describe your childhood. What events or things do you remember about your home?
- 6. What values did your parents stress? What were your parents' expectations of you?
- 7. What are your first memories of the United States/this neighborhood?
- 8. (If applicable) Did you have problems adjusting to life in a new country? Give examples.
- 9. Where did you go to school? Did you go to college? What did you study?
- 10. Did you marry? Whom did you marry? How did you meet? How did you decide to marry?
- 11. What jobs have you held? What did you enjoy and what did you hate about each of your jobs?
- 12. Have you experienced unfair treatment? What happened and why do you think it happened?
- 13. Did or do you participate in any community events or organizations? Describe your participation and experiences.
- 14. What historic events have had an impact on your life? How?
- 15. What have you come to value most in life? How did you come to hold these values?
- 16. What goals do you have for yourself?
- 17. (If applicable) Have your views about living in the United States changed at all? If so, how?
- 18. What do you see as the best or happiest time in your life?
